




Revenue and expense development (2009-2013)*




people received emergency relief after disasters and crises (emergency and hygiene kits, food, drinking water, winter relief, emergency shelters, and more).



We built 120 emergency shelters, 294 new homes and one children's home, helping families start over after a disaster. 175,573 **8**

58 health care facilities were built or restored, ensuring better access to medical services, 173,573 pre- and post-natal care examinations for pregnant women were conducted in health clinics we support, ensuring a safe pregnancy and delivery for mothers and a healthy start for babies.



Every year, nearly seven million children under five years of age die from diseases, malnutrition or lack of hygiene.

We protected 6,498 newborn babies and infants from malnutrition and undernourishment with therapeutic foods enriched with important vitamins and minerals.

323

323 disaster preparedness trainings showed children, teenagers and adults how to behave before, during and after a disaster in order to protect themselves and help others. 140 villages and communities now have disaster management plans, the population knows exactly how to react during an emergency.
